Notice of Adoption of a Revised Local Development Plan Eryri Local Development Plan 2016-2031

On February 6th, 2019, Snowdonia National Park Authority adopted a revised Local Development Plan (LDP) for the Snowdonia National Park area. The adopted LDP will form the development plan for the Snowdonia National Park area and will be the basis for decisions on land use planning in this area.

Copies of the adopted LDP, the recommendations of the person appointed to hold the independent examination, the sustainability appraisal report (incorporating the environmental report), the consultation report and the adoption statement indicating how the environmental report etc. has been taken into account are available for inspection free of charge at the National Park Office, Penrhyndeudraeth, at public libraries in Barmouth, Bethesda, Blaenau Ffestiniog, Dolgellau, Penygroes, Tywyn, Porthmadog, Y Bala, Cerrigydrudion, Llanrwst, Llanfairfechan, Penmaenmawr, Conwy and at the Authority's Information Centre in Betws y Coed during normal opening times. They are also available on the Authority's website at www.snowdonia.gov.wales/ldp.

Copies of the LDP, including its proposals map, will be available for purchase by contacting the Authority

The LDP became operative on its adoption, i.e. on February 6th, 2019.

A person aggrieved by the LDP who desires to question its validity on the ground that it is not within the powers conferred by Part 6 of the Planning and Compulsory Purchase Act 2004 or that any requirement of that Act or any regulation made under it has not been complied with in relation to the adoption of the LDP, may, within six weeks from 14th February 2019, make an application to the High Court under Section 113 of the 2004 Act.
